Chemist used skills to make perms, paint

Scientist from Oak Brook worked at old Helene Curtis, USG Corp.

As a chemist, Dr. Paul H. Neill was so innovative and creative that his career ranged from coal chemistry at Argonne National Laboratory to developing haircare products at Unilever.

But most recently, he worked on developing new products for joint compounds, textures and paints for USG Corp. in Liberty-ville

"It was about his creativity and his innovation," said his supervisor Terry Rosenstiel, associate director of the performance surfaces laboratory, where Dr. Neill was principal research scientist. "He had wide-ranging tastes. He could look at a complex problem and throw away the waste and garbage and put it in simple terms and talk to you about it."

Dr. Neill, 52, of Oak Brook, died of cancer Sunday, April 13, in his home.

From 1989 to 2002, Dr. Neill was principal scientist at Helene Curtis Inc., which was purchased by Unilever. Dr. Neill concentrated on new product development for hair care, in particular perms and colors.

Dr. Neill was one of the lead scientists who developed heat-activated conditioners such as the Thermasilk line, said former colleague John Wydila.

"But what Paul was really good at was taking an idea and then developing it so it became intellectual property," Wydila said. "It is one thing to have good science. It's another leap to have it become a patent and to have it written in a way where it can be defended."

Dr. Neill, an only child, was born and raised in Glenside, Pa., where his father also was a chemist. After graduating from high school in 1973, Dr. Neill attended Catawba College in North Carolina. He graduated with two bachelor's of science degrees in chemistry and biology in 1977.

He went to graduate school at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, where he received a master's of science degree in analytical chemistry in 1982.

While at the university, he also met his wife, Sumaria Mohan-Neill, and the couple married in 1980. He completed his education in material science and engineering at Penn State University. He earned a doctorate in 1985.

Dr. Neill came to Argonne, near Lemont, in 1982 on a post-doctorate research fellowship. He worked in coal chemistry and alternative fuel science there for the next six years until he went to work for Helene Curtis.

Dr. Neill was as at ease in a laboratory as he was under the hood of a car, friends said.

"He was so smart and so very bright. He would help anybody on a whole range of things, whether it was on a research project [or] if your car wouldn't start," Wydila said.

Dr. Neill was also a member of the American Chemical Society and a Boy Scout leader in the Des Plaines area in 1990s.

"Paul was such a quiet and simple man, and now that he is gone, I'm glad that people have seen that Paul was really so very amazing," his wife said. "He was the most intelligent, caring and selfless person you could ever meet."

Dr. Neill is also survived by a daughter, Indira; a son, Christopher; and his mother, Jeanne.

A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. May 24 in St. Peter's United Church of Christ, 125 W. Church St., Elmhurst.
