Prevention of pressure ulcer: When, where, who and why start with prevention of pressure ulcer

Introduction: Seventeen percent of hospitalized patients have or will end up having a PU. In the worldwide geriatric population, 71% of patients ≥ 70 years have PU. Pressure ulcers (PU) is skin breakdown and continuum of tissue damage localized injury to the skin. Intrinsic factors: Immobilization, cognitive deficit, chronic illness (eg, diabetes mellitus) poor nutrition, use of steroids, aging. Extrinsic factors (pressure, friction, humidit, shearforce).

Characteristics: Pain, infectious complications, prolonged and expensive hospitalizations, persistent open ulcers.

Treatments: Why? Increased risk of the death. Associated with the development of pressure ulcers. HOW? PREVENTIONS. WHERE? Intensive care unit (ICU). Postoperative care begins

immediately after surgery. Includes pain management and wound care!!!
